



"Carol joined Mole Valley Quilters in the late 1980's and as so often happens she soon found herself on the Committee. Several of our current members remember that she was the first person that new members spoke to as she warmly welcomed them to meetings. She was on the Committee for a total of seven years and in 2010 she organized a Quilt Exhibition in the church. It was an amazing achievement and we have been in awe of her organisational skills ever since. In 2014 she produced a lovely photobook of the next Exhibition – she was never afraid of hard work!

For many years she was a member of a house group which met on a Thursday evening when we shared ideas and sat sewing together. Actually, we probably spent more time talking than sewing! Carol kept us entertained with her enthusiasm for new ideas and gadgets which she would find on her frequent visits to quilt shows here and in the United States. When our group was involved in organising the Christmas party she had plenty of ideas for activities and was willing to lead them, often donating prizes from her stash.

Several members have special memories of sitting next to Carol at a sewing workshop admiring her skill and her speed. She was a very talented needlewoman and had often finished a task while the rest of us were still sorting our fabrics. She always had at least one project on the go, whether it was a banner for the Mother's Union or a kneeler for the church, or a Christmas gift for one of the family. If she was not quilting or sewing she would be knitting and making cards.

We will all treasure memories of her skill, enthusiasm and kindness."
