

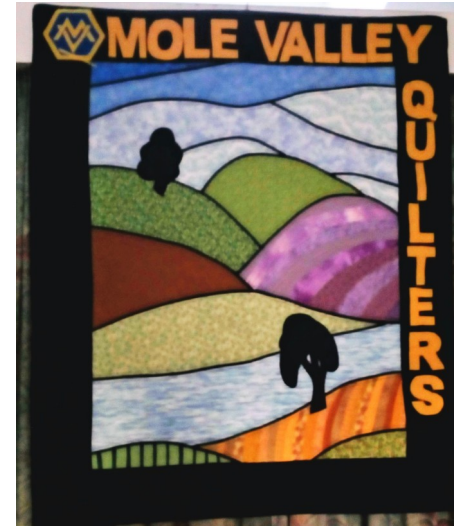


# Mole Valley Quilters

#### The Project

A quilt of three layers using any patchwork, quilting and embellishing technique—the concept, the style the design is all yours.

#### Size and Shape

Any size up to A3—ie you can do a mini quilt or A4 size up to A3—either landscape or portrait.

#### The Label

Please put your name and title of your quilt on the back

#### The Finish

A sleeve on the back would be helpful for hanging your quilt which should be finished by the end of the year so that they can be hung and judged the next time Mole Valley Quilters meet at the barn Hall.
