
THE NEXT MEETING IS

TIPS FOR QUILTERS

I use a rolling lint-remover to get rid of loose threads. I go over the back of the quilt carefully and remove all threads before I sandwich the layers for quilting. Removing threads at this point is far less timeconsuming that trying to pick them out (if they shadow through) after the quilting is completed
